# 20 riders left on a bicycle journey that followed the 1,000-mile perimeter of Pennsylvania.

This inaugural Pennsylvania Perimeter Ride Against Cancer (PPRAC) raised \$20,000 for the Lehigh Valley Unit of the American Cancer Society. Today, the PPRAC is organized on an every-other-year format with riders covering 500 miles in six days of cycling through some of the most scenic roads leading to Pennsylvania. Over the years we've raised over a million dollars.


**2015.** We have 70 riders who have made a commitment to fight cancer. In return, they will experience a well-organized, challenging, beautiful and memorable ride.

The American Cancer Society is the nationwide community-based voluntary health organization dedicated to eliminating cancer as a major health problem by preventing cancer, saving lives, and diminishing suffering from cancer, through research, education, advocacy, and service.

**Dream Come True**'s mission is to promote and enrich the lives of children who are seriously, chronically or terminally ill. We offer children with life threatening illnesses the chance to hope, dream and live their fantasies.

Dream Come True fulfills dreams for children who have been diagnosed with a life altering medical illness. Dreams can be trips, cruises, meeting celebrities, redecorated bedrooms, shopping sprees and special gifts. Once a child has been fulfilled a dream from Dream Come True they are eligible for our college scholarship program if they attend college in the future. They are awarded an annual scholarship up to 5 years. If a child unfortunately passes away Dream Come True helps with funeral expenses.

95% of the funds raised by the rides supports these two charities. 85% to the Lehigh Valley American Cancer Society and 15% to Dreams Come True.



#### The Pennsylvania Perimeter Ride Against

Cancer is a six-day cycling tour. It is not a race and the route is mapped accordingly. The route is scenic, enjoyable and at times quite arduous. Organizers typically find the most challenging and rewarding hills along the way.

The 2015 route for the Pennsylvania Perimeter Ride Against Cancer begins in Syracuse, New York, wraps around some of the Finger Lakes, goes past the Grand Canyon of Pennsylvania, and then up and over some of the hills along the Susquehanna River on the way to the finish in Palmerton, PA.

- Day 3 Watkins Glen, NY to Wellsboro, PA: 75 Miles
- Day 4 Wellsboro to Lock Haven, PA: 80 Miles
- Day 5 Lock Haven to Bloomsburg, PA: 100 Miles
- Day 6 Bloomsburg to Palmerton, PA: 70 Miles
